

THREE 10-ROUND FIGHTS TO FEATURE NEW ARENA OPENING

**Arizona Boys
Matched With
Coast Boxers**

THREE 10-round fights and a six-round melee, toasting the crew of Arizona boxing talent as invaders from the Pacific Coast will make up the first boxing program to be presented at the opening of the new \$15,000 "Madison Square Garden" arena on North Seventh avenue. The fight card will be presented under the auspices of the Dismal American Veterans next Thursday night.

The 10-round bouts will all be of equal importance. Allen Whitlow of Superior meeting Raymond Lugo of Los Angeles; Owen Phelps of Phoenix going up against Ted Soder of Ventura, Calif., and Bob Miller of Melrose, of Phoenix meeting French King of Fresno.

Whitlow was scheduled to meet Jackie Mandell on this opening card of the new arena but Mandell fought Fidel La Barba at Hollywood Friday night and received a cut so serious that he will not be able to fight again for at least a month. Raymond Lugo has met Zorilla, Benny Kid Carter, Nationalistic and most of the best boxers on the coast and is rated among the topnotchers in the 115-pound class.

Slayer Is Tough
Ted Sluder, the boy who meets Phelps, weighs 119 and has fought several semidinals at the Olympic club and at Hollywood. He knocked out a colored heavyweight at Wilmington last week and is rated as one of the hardest punchers among the present light-heavyweights on the coast.

Lugo has never met Whitlow before nor has Sluder ever met Phelps, but Matchmakers C. L. McPherson and Jack Sullivan of Madison Square Arena believe that they have two cracking good fights.

The other 10-round bout may have a bit of feeling in it. French King of Fresno is to meet Bobby Melodeo and they met once before at Phoenix. King came here expecting an easy fight and Melodeo took the decision. King was only too glad to get another crack at Melodeo. Since fighting Melodeo here, King won a decision six months ago over Young Naumann at El Centro.

Sign Sluggers

Neither of the boys in the curtain-raiser, Mountain Lion Kimball or F-Bone Firpo, need introduction. They are not classy boxers but they can slug and they are both willing fighters.

Emmett Lethwaite of the firm of Kennedy and Lethwaite, who are handling coast matches for the new arena, will bring all three of his coast fighters to Phoenix Tuesday night. They will work out in public at the public opening of the new arena on Wednesday evening and will weigh in for their bouts at 10 o'clock Thursday morning. All of the fights are at catchweights.

The new arena will be the scene of its first wrestling bout a Monday, September 9, when the winner of the Visser-Sauer bout Tuesday goes up against Jimmy Londos.

Riders Start Long Contest At Republican

THE class of motorcycle racing talent in Arizona, some of the fastest machines and most daring pilots in California, will battle over 200-mile mountain and desert race courses today for cash and merchandise prizes.

The race will start and finish here, the solo and sidecar pilots flashing away from in front of The Arizona Republican office at 3 o'clock this morning and finishing the long endurance run about 1:30 or 2 o'clock this afternoon at the Grand Canal on Lateral 16.

Ten solo racers and four sidecar pilots, possessing some of the fast machines to be found in the Southwest, had entered today's endurance run at a late hour last night.

Local solo entries include Cy Kendall, Roy Ekins, Alex Robi, Bill Gardner and Wild Bill Morgan. Prescott entries are Fred Schneider and Elwood Waiter, while Flagstaff is represented by C. W. Hester, Jr. El Centro, California sent L. Boldo and Long Beach is represented by Dell Fountain, one of the favorites in the contest.

Side car entries include Bill Kennedy and New Lott; F. A. Davis and Claude Webb, and C. Hender- shot and Jack Hines. Prescott also has a dangerous entry in the sidecar class, Ed Jungenberg and Clarence Peacock.

Leaving The Republican office, the riders will be escorted for the first 15 miles of the race by Al Rhodes and Joe Keithly, county motorcycle officers, who will force the riders to stay within the speed limit.

At the Agua Fria river bridge the contingent will be turned loose and will roar away across the desert on the White Spar highway toward Prescott. On the return trip the riders will use the Black Canyon road, which is reported in rough condition.

It was necessary to place the finish line at the Grand canal on lateral 16 to protect the riders from downtown traffic, which they would encounter if they attempted to come nearer the city. The present finish line will allow as fast a finish as the machines will stand.

First place will pay the winner 80 per cent of his class entry money and a tire. The first Arizona rider to finish will receive a silver loving cup on top of the other prize be won.

Second prize will be 20 per cent of the class entry money. Third place, solo, will win a speedometer; third place, sidecar, will win a carburetor and 10 feet of drive chain.

Fourth place, solo, will take a motorcycle battery, and fourth place, sidecar, wins a riding helmet.
